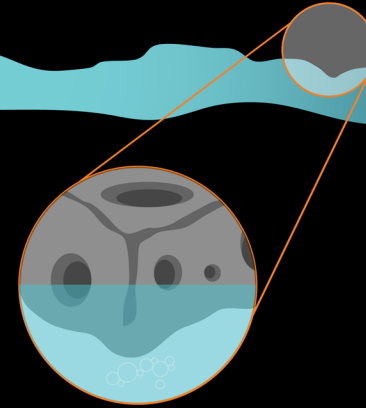

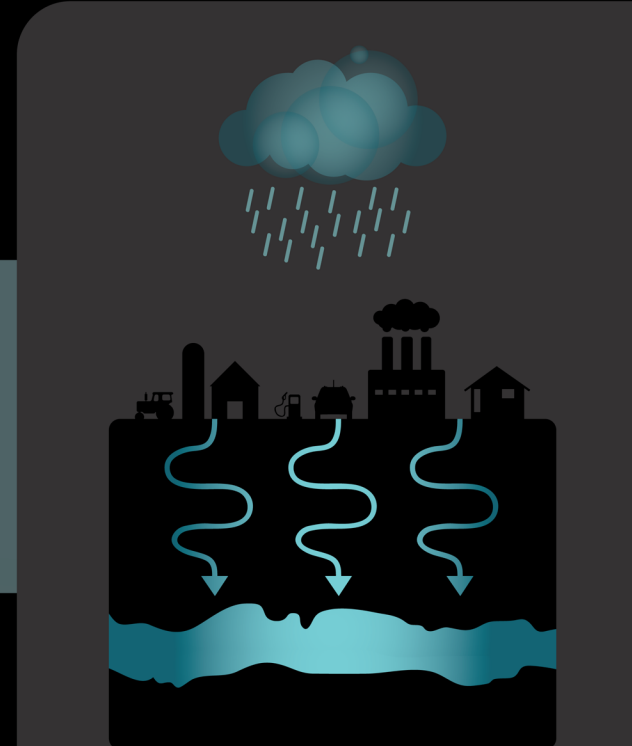
LIKE A SPONGE

Under your feet is a distinctive landscape known as *karst*. Karst landscapes mostly form in limestone. This rock can develop holes that can hold water like a sponge, and allow water to move freely through it. All of Bowling Green sits on top of a karst landscape.



GO WITH THE FLOW

Water can rapidly travel from the surface to subsurface in karst areas. As rain falls and flows over the landscape, the runoff picks up pollutants and eventually seeps into the ground where it replenishes rivers, wells and springs.
